**Salem Sound Coastwatch Presents the Massachusetts Premiere of  
"A SEA CHANGE - Imagine a World Without Fish"  
to Mark World Ocean Day**

For World Ocean Day, Salem Sound Coastwatch and CinemaSalem are hosting the Massachusetts premiere of the new documentary film "*A Sea Change - Imagine a World Without Fish.*"

The free screening, which will be followed by a question and answer session, will take place on Sunday, June 7, 2009 at 10:00 am at CinemaSalem, One East India Square, Salem, MA. The CinemaSalem Café will be open at 9:30 for coffee and treats.

*A Sea Change* uses breathtaking footage of the natural world to bring attention to the crucial but little-known issue of ocean acidification caused by climate change. The film follows Sven Huseby, an engaging grandfather and educator, who after discovering that the effects of climate change extends to the sea, embarks on an odyssey to gain a better understanding of the problem and to learn how to start curing it.

Along with his wife, award winning film director Barbara Ettinger, Sven travels the world to meet with leading oceanographers and global warming experts. His journeys take him from fishing villages in Alaska to barren glacial beaches in Norway.

Shot by cinematographer Claudia Raschke-Robinson (*Mad Hot Ballroom*, *My Architect*), the film is interwoven with a tapestry of wilderness on land and stunning underwater footage.

"*A Sea Change* was shown to sold-out crowds and excellent reviews at the San Francisco International Film Festival and the Environmental Film Festival in the Nation's Capital," said Barbara Warren, Executive Director of Salem Sound Coastwatch.

"The message of the film is presented in a gentle manner, it conveys hope for the future, and it is suitable for families," she continued.

"We are grateful for CinemaSalem's willingness to donate their facilities so that everyone can see it," Warren concluded.

The question and answer session following the screening will feature Rob Moir, Executive Director of the Ocean River Institute and Barbara Warren, Executive Director of Salem Sound Coastwatch.
